National Security Garden is a public art installation by Shannon McMullen and Fabian Winkler based on critical gardening strategies in which soybeans are mobilized to address global national food security in a post surplus world. The project, installed outside Purdue University's Elliott Hall of Music, is a hybrid form combining elements of agricultural fields and representational gardens. The gallery exhibition documents the project from conception to creation. Through the involvement of students from HONR 199: Hunger and Food Security, the installation also contributes to interdisciplinary collaboration and discussion.
